**Describe the project and what will be done or happen.:** We would like to create a school yarn garden on a school campus in the Panama-Buena Vista Union School District. As California begins to re-open schools after COVID lock downs, students are eager to resume their educational activities. We would like to use yarn material to convert a chain-linked fence into a welcoming mural, resembling a garden. We will reach out to artistic members of our AOR and our friends at the Art Association of Kern (one of our local art enthusiast organizations) to sketch the mural. We will then scale it to the fence size and mark the sketch. We will then have our members tie the yarn according to the sketch.

What are the goals of the project? : The goal of the project is to transform one of the schools in a neighborhood in the Panama Buena Vista Union School District into a vibrant welcome to students returning to school.

What are the plans for converting this temporary project into a long-term or permanent project? : The ultimate goal of this project is to encourage elementary schools to be a hub of color and vibrancy in neighborhoods. We would like to extend this each year to every school in the PBVUSD and the other 46 school districts in Kern County.

Location of Project (i.e., alley, vacant lot, open space, street, etc.) and current condition of the site: The location will be at Laurelglen Elementary School (2601 El Portal Drive, Bakersfield, CA 93309). The fence faces the residential neighborhood, as well as the modular classrooms located on campus. Our local elementary schools have seen huge increases in student enrollment, and due to funding and how schools receive their funding in California, schools must utilize temporary modular buildings for years before they are able to expand the campus with permanent buildings.
